Community Foundation of Plymouth Welcomes Plymouth Community Foster Closet

Plymouth Community Foster Closet (PCFC) opened their doors in August of this year. Their mission is to provide free clothing and other necessities while a child is in foster care, extending through to reunification, adoption or as a child ages out. Since opening, they have been able to serve hundreds of children, hoping to serve many more throughout the holiday season!

Amongst clothing and day-to-day necessities, Plymouth Community Foster Closet provides forms for families to fill out with requests for other items they need. PCFC also held a backpack drive before the school year began that benefitted 50 children. Many more have since picked up backpacks.

Constantly filling the requests of children in foster care, Plymouth Community Foster Closet has already changed the lives of 200 and counting!

Westland Community Foundation Spreads Christmas Joy Throughout the Year

Founded in 1996, Westland Community Foundation (WCF) has contributed over \$1 million to organizations and student scholarships within the community. This past July, they hosted their annual Christmas in July at the Hellenic Cultural Center. Attendees were asked to bring bags of food to benefit the Wayne-Westland Salvation Army for those in need of a little cheer this summer. This was their first event being partnered with the Local Impact Alliance.

In early December, Westland Community Foundation held a toy drive with one goal in mind – no child without a toy this holiday season. Guests brought unwrapped toys to put under the tree to benefit underprivileged children. Westland Community Foundation continues to emit Christmas Cheer throughout the year!







Helping Children, One Eagle at a Time

Eagles for Children is a golf-based organization that provides a fun, social way to raise money for local disadvantaged children's charities. The Eagles for Children program is simple. They recruit country clubs to enroll in their program where each club member pledges a minimum of \$2 per eagle scored at their course during the year. The money is pooled and, at the end of the year, each country club determines to which local children's charities they will grant their funds.

In 2012, realizing the vast number of children in need right outside their club gates, co-founders Don Kegley and Hal Zaima put the Eagles for Children program to test at Oakland Hills Country Club. Three other country clubs joined that year, and they were able to raise nearly \$40,000 to benefit 14 children's organizations. Fast forward to 2022; 18 clubs raised over \$1 million to grant to 144 children's charities ... FOR THE KIDS!!


